## Works Cited Page: Format

- Label the page **Works Cited** and center. (Do not italicize the words, or put in quotation marks).
- Use double spacing for all citations (but do not put extra lines between citations).
- Indent the second and subsequent lines of citations five spaces so that you create a hanging indent.

<p>The Works Cited page begins on a new page. Center the title "Works Cited" without underlining, bolding, or italicizing it. If there is only one entry, title this page "Work Cited."</p>	<p>The Works Cited page is a list of all the sources cited in your paper.</p>	<p>Angeli 10</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Works Cited</p>	<p>MLA now requires all sources to have a publication marker. For example, books receive the marker "Print" after the citation.</p>
<p>MLA no longer requires URLs in the Works Cited. - Punctuation is important!
- Your Works Cited Page should only include sources that you cite in your paper!
- Your works cited page should be in alphabetical order (by author's last name)
